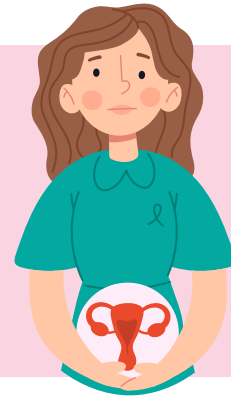

WHAT ARE GYNECOLOGIC CANCERS?

Gynecologic cancers include cancers of the:

- Ovary
- Uterus
- Cervix
- Vulva
- Vagina



UNITED STATES STATISTICS

- Over 116,000 women are diagnosed with a gynecologic cancer each year in the U.S.
- Approximately 34,000 women die from gynecologic cancers annually.
- Uterine cancer is the most common gynecologic cancer.
- Ovarian cancer causes the most deaths among gynecologic cancers.

SOUTH CAROLINA SNAPSHOT

- Hundreds of women in South Carolina are diagnosed with gynecologic cancers each year.
- Mortality rates in the Southeast remain higher than the national average for several gynecologic cancers.
- Early detection significantly improves survival rates, yet many women delay seeking care due to vague symptoms.



KNOW THE SYMPTOMS

Many gynecologic cancer symptoms are subtle. Persistent changes matter.

Watch For:

- Abnormal vaginal bleeding or discharge
- Pelvic or abdominal pain
- Bloating that does not go away
- Feeling full quickly when eating
- Frequent urination or urgency
- Pain during intercourse
- Changes in bowel habits
